The Education Programme is a key component of Carnival 365, which is our aim of spreading the traditions of Carnival all year round. From traditional costume making to Black History Month outreach, assemblies and steel pan drumming lessons, we bring the spirit of Carnival to schools and the community, 365 days a year.

We brought 3 programmes to schools this year:

Condensed Carnival - programme of dance, drumming, costumes and assemblies

Unspoken Conversation - workshops focussing on positive activism, cultural awareness and black history

Exposure - programme focussing on people's journeys and inspiring the next generation of Bristolians

We are grateful to receive support from the Paul Hamlyn Trust to enable us to continue this work with full funding for the next two years.

Post Colston / Open Community Meeting

Both events held at Docklands Community Centre allowed the community to come together and meet safely despite Covid.

The first event, A Year Since Colston - What Next? was panel discussion to mark a year since the felling of the Colston statue - looking at the impact of those events and what they hope for Bristol's future now the statue is gone.

Our two virtual events in 2021 were great successes; the first was a Global Carnival panel discussion on the Evolution of Carnival featuring input from Trinidad & Tobago, St Lucia and Notting Hill Carnivals, as well as performances from Teddyson John and Nialah Blackman.

For the first time, we presented a three-part virtual event celebrating the African-Caribbean community and discussing the experiences of those impacted by Windrush. The event was delivered by a team of UWE Event Management students with the aim of educating attendees on the lived experience of those from the Windrush community in Bristol as well as encouraging and supporting those to speak about the topic.

What did you learn? 'I've learned so much more on real-life experiences and exchanged knowledge with others.'

What is one thing that you will take away from the event? 'Being comfortable in my own skin and my heritage. There may be people who judge others for their ancestral heritage, but it's nothing to be ashamed of. In fact, our heritage can make us proud and open up new opportunities.'
